

Chairman's Annual Report

It is always pleasing to report a profitable year but that is not what Hearing Dogs for the Deaf is all about. We exist to train dogs for the deaf and to ensure that those dogs that support the deaf continue to assist them.

The strategic plan for Hearing Dogs NZ is on track through the diversification and responsiveness of the staff and volunteers.

COVID 19 EFFECT

Covid 19 turned our world upside down as it did to many other businesses and people. It had an effect on our outputs, as we were unable to train dogs at the normal rate. We are now back in business and on track again. Fortunately we were able to receive support from the government for almost \$56,000 which was all passed on to our frustrated staff, and achieved the goal of maintaining their employment.

BEQUESTS

Our work was again rewarded by a much appreciated bequest of \$130,000 plus some smaller bequests this year. In 2018 the trustees of the day decided to spend that abnormal bequest of \$125,000 on attempting to expand the business. The current trustees have decided on a different path and plan to maintain the business at similar levels and use these funds over numerous years to provide a quality service.

SURPLUS

If the total bequests for the year of \$157,000 had not been received the operations for the year would still have shown a surplus. Thanks must go to our manager Clare, who set a tight budget, had it approved by the board, and kept to that budget, except for some Covid issues. By diversifying and the introduction of "Doggy Day care Wednesday", she has generated additional income (almost \$10,000 for part year), increased our awareness in the local community and seen an increased use of our facilities.

VOLUNTEERS & STAFF

As illustrated in this annual report we are more than ever reliant on the huge number of volunteer hours every week to operate. With over 1800 hours voluntary and just over 100 paid staff hours per week demonstrating how much this charity is community based.

There are three new staff members on the team this year and coupled with the experience of existing staff we are in a much sounder place for growth and meeting our future goals. Tracey is working with the dogs and feeding them and locking up the Centre in the evenings, giving Delwyn more time to train. Maura is working with the Recipients in the placement and assessments of the partnership while Terry is moving to more of a semi-retirement phase and Lisa is handing the social media, newsletters, visual images and face of Hearing Dogs NZ.

FUTURE

I am confident that with Clare continuing to manage the operations, and with Trustees oversight but not interference, the next few years should see a growth in training and levels of placement. The financial hurdles are behind us and we now have a sound Balance Sheet.

Friends in DEED - Assist Dogs & their People








*Financial overview as at 31st March 2021.
